FAIR to whom? Data sharing in the Open Humanities

Open Science initiatives tend to draw on data sharing practices in the natural sciences. Humanities scholars are therefore often sceptical of attempts to make data FAIR, assuming that the FAIR principles are geared towards quantitative rather than qualitative data. Humanities scholars also have different ideas about what makes data sharing 'fair'. Building on three examples of Open Humanities projects, this talk looks at how we can engage the humanities in Open Science and make data FAIR for both quantitative and qualitative research.
